Blackboard Discussion Board Quick Guide

What is a Discussion Board?

A **Discussion Board** is an asynchronous communication tool that allows students to collaborate with others through posting or answering questions. Students respond to a discussion board forum topic by creating a thread, or replying to an existing thread. Faculty can create a **course discussion board** forum where all students can participate and contribute to the discussion, or a **group discussion board** where only members of a particular group can access it. Faculty can determine whether or not to enable grading for each discussion board forum. Discussion boards can only be viewed from Blackboard and are not publically accessible. A **discussion board** can also be referred to as a forum, message board, or bulletin board.

Creating a Discussion Board Forum

- 1. From the Control Panel, click **Course Tools**
- Click Discussion Board (Faculty can create a Discussion Board link to display as part of the Course Menu)
- 3. Click Create Forum
- 4. On the **Create Forum** page, provide a forum name and description
- 5. Set Forum Availability to 'Yes'
- 6. Establish Forum Settings
 - a. Viewing Threads/Replies –
 Set to Standard View or
 Participants must create a thread in order to view other threads in this forum
 - b. Grade Set to No Grading in Forum, Grade Discussion Forum (provide points possible), or Grade Threads. (If using a Rubric, see the Blackboard Rubrics Quick Guide)
 - c. Alignments Set Forum alignments or Thread alignments
 - d. Subscribe Set **Do not allow** subscriptions, Allow members

- f. Additional Options Set Allow Post Tagging or Allow Members to Rate Posts
- 7. Click 'Submit'

Grading a Discussion Board Forum

- 1. If grading for the discussion board has been enabled, from the Control Panel, click Course Tools
- 2. Click Discussion Board
- 3. Click on the Discussion Board forum to grade
- 4. Click on Grade Discussion Forum
- 5. Determine the student you would like to grade, and click on the Grade button
- 6. After reading the student's original post and comments on the page, click Edit Grade under Forum Grade
- 7. If a rubric has been used, click Grading Rubric for Discussion Boards
- 8. Grade according to level of accomplishment for each category. The total score will be automatically tabulated. Click Submit
- 9. If appropriate, enter comments to the student under Feedback
- 10. If appropriate, enter notes under Grading Notes (notes can only be seen by the course instructor)
- 11. Click the Save Grade button
- 12. To grade the next contributor, either click on the forward/backward 💷 button below the Save Grade button, or select the name of another contributor. Otherwise, scroll to the bottom of the page and click on the **OK** button
